




If DUNDEE STRATHMARTINE were a village of 100 people...

- > 8 would be in primary school; 4 would be in high school
- > 25 would be aged between 25 and 44
- > 18 would be aged 65 or over
- > 75 would be of working age (16-74), including
 - 24 who have no qualifications; 15 who have a University degree
 - 31 who work full time; 13 who are retired
- 94 would describe themselves as 'White Scottish'
- > 5 would describe their health as bad or very bad
- > 10 would be providing unpaid care
- 28 would say they belonged to the Church of Scotland

If DUNDEE STRATHMARTINE were a village of 100 households...

- > 28 households would consist of one person, 12 of whom are aged 65 and over
- > 30 would have have dependent children (aged under 16, or under 18 in full-time education)
- > 26 would be in rented accomodation
- 72 would have access to at least one car or van
- > 3 would speak a language other than English in the home


Population Breakdown by Age-group






99% of people over 3 in the parish speak English well (99% Presbytery; 99% Scotland)

Ethnicity across the country *







Population Breakdown by Health and Care Provision





Household Breakdown by Household Tenure









Household composition














